What's the D2A data showing us?

The latest data showed that a total of 1,276 people were transferred for further assessment on a D2A pathway from Chesterfield Royal and Royal Derby Hospitals during the period of June-August this year.

Of the 1,276 patients, 78 patients were unable to access the identified appropriate pathway

and were transferred to an alternative higher level pathway. Further work is being undertaken to establish the resources required to enable people to access the right pathway.

Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) have been developed for the City and County Pathway 2 beds. The aims of the SOP's are to support well-organised, safe and timely admissions, discharges and transfers for all people admitted to a P2 bed.

The SOP's set out specific standards how health and social care teams will work together with people and their families to:

- Identify a planned date of discharge and discharge destination
- Agree realistic goals which enable people
- Build confidence to equip people/families to manage their own health and well-being with appropriate support

The SOP's are being launched through a series of workshops during October.
