Further to the achievements for Cohorts 1 to 4 against the 15 February milestone we are forging ahead with Cohort 5 where we are already making significant progress and also Cohort 6 which is described as those who are clinically vulnerable. We are working with national colleagues to address some of the areas of clarification for Cohort 6 which have been covered extensively in the media over recent days but in the meantime we are continuing to invite and vaccinate our patients in this cohort.

Whilst we are continuing to make good progress in the programme we know there is still a long way to go and that our health and care system continues to be under pressure. This makes it all the more important that we not only deliver the vaccination programme as quickly as possible but that we also continue to follow the government guidelines that keep us and those around us safe. Please help us to share this message.

Help us to share important messages

Please help us to share the following important messages:

- If you are over 70 or are Clinically Extremely Vulnerable and have not yet had a vaccination but would like one please contact your GP
- We are now working on the 65 to 69 age range and if you have not yet received your invitation for a vaccination, please be patient as you will receive one shortly
- If you are classed as clinically vulnerable and at increased risk from Covid-19 you will also be receiving an invitation very soon - see the initial list of conditions below with more detail to follow
- If you are a carer please keep a look out for important information about your vaccination
- If you are a shielded patient you will be receiving some important information about your

- vaccination
- We are now moving into the second dose phase working in date order for those who received their vaccination at the start of the programme in December

The JCVI defines patients who are clinically vulnerable as those with:

- chronic respiratory disease, including chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), cystic fibrosis and severe asthma
- chronic heart disease (and vascular disease)
- chronic kidney disease
- chronic liver disease
- chronic neurological disease including epilepsy
- Down's syndrome
- severe and profound learning disability
- diabetes
- solid organ, bone marrow and stem cell transplant recipients
- people with specific cancers
- immunosuppression due to disease or treatment
- asplenia and splenic dysfunction
- morbid obesity
- severe mental illness





- Anyone aged 65 years old or over
- If you are over 70 years old but not received your vaccination yet, please contact your GP practice
- Anyone who is extremely clinically vulnerable.
- Anyone else who is recorded by their GP as being “at risk” from Covid-19.
