Breast Cancer

Symptoms include:

- a change in the size or shape of either breasts
- discharge from either nipples, which may be streaked with blood
- a lump or swelling in either of the armpits
- dimpling on the skin on breasts
- a rash on or around the nipple
- a change in the appearance of the nipple, such as becoming sunken into the breast

Liver Cancer

Cancer that starts in the liver (primary liver cancer) doesn't usually cause symptoms in the early stages. Symptoms include:

- weight loss
- itching
- feeling sick
- yellowing of the skin and whites of the eyes (jaundice)
- swollen tummy (abdomen)
- loss of appetite or feeling full after eating small amounts
- pain in your abdomen
- a lump in the right side of your abdomen
- pain in your right shoulder
