| What was the aim of the project ? | How was it done? | What were the outcomes? |

| <p>A Hostel (for homeless adults) received money for a breakfast room within the hostel. The project wanted to work with the residents to work out how to spend the money and how the breakfast room could be organised.</p> | <p>Staff had a group meeting with all residents and discussed together about how to spend the money for the breakfast room. The residents spoke about what they would want, IE – cereals, toaster, plates, bowls etc. Agreed what times it should open and shut and who's responsibilities was to clean and manage it. This was agreed together and wrote up to put in house rules for new residents. It was regular reviewed at residents' meetings.</p> | <p>That resident had a breakfast room that they took responsibly for and it was regular reviewed by new residents to ensure it worked for everyone.</p> |
