AN EXCITING YEAR AHEAD

In case you missed it, we recently published our first **annual report**, which you can view [here](#) The report gives a rundown of who we are, what we have been up to this past year and the **themes** we will be working on in **2022/2023**.

The report was presented at our **first AGM** on March 15th, where Anne Marie was voted in as Chair of Derbyshire Maternity and Neonatal Voices, after Co-Chair Shilpa stepped down. A **massive thank you to Shilpa** for all her work and enthusiasm over this past year -we are so glad Shilpa will be staying on as member of DMNV.



MATERNAL MENTAL HEALTH

The meeting kicked off with a short presentation from **Sarah Hyland**, Clinical Psychologist for **the Maternal Mental Health Service**, a new and very welcomed service which is being developed in Derbyshire. The MMHS will look in particular to fill in the gaps to **support women** who currently fall outside the perinatal mental health service, for instance **following a loss**, and who experience **moderate to severe mental health difficulties**. Women will normally be referred into the service post 4 weeks loss

The MMHS will be run by **specialist midwives and clinical psychologists** and will offer services such as psychological support & EMDR therapy alongside support from peer support workers and assistant psychologists. Derbyshire Maternity and Neonatal Voices will be providing **service user input** to help shape the pathway to this great new service as it launches. **Thank you Sarah** for introducing the service to us and for answering all our questions!

INFORMATION ON THE WARD


Emily Brocklebank, midwife from **UHDB**, spoke to us about how a lot of antenatal education was lost during the pandemic, and **information moved online** to guarantee access to the service.

Currently on the postnatal ward at UHDB there is a discharge DVD about what to expect in the first few days caring for baby. Emily is working hard to **produce new videos**, providing a revamp of the information and breaking it down into an **admission and discharge** video, alongside the antenatal education videos.

Emily would really welcome **feedback from service users** to make sure the videos **meet the needs of parents**. If you would like to **review the scripts** for the admission and discharge videos, send us an email, your input would be really appreciated!



PLEASE SHARE YOUR EXPERIENCE



We have received feedback from a few women who told us how they found it **difficult, physically and emotionally**, to **reach their babies** in their cots **following a c-section or other intervention** and recovering **on the ward**. We have been asked to **collect more feedback** on this issue to learn more about what worked well, what didn't and what could have helped.

We also wanted to know if **side cots**, attached to the bed on the ward, **would have been helpful** in these situations. If you have any experience you would like to **share with us** on this subject, please don't hesitate to get in touch!

NEONATAL UPDATES

"We've had the pleasure of linking up with some of the staff at **Queens Hospital Burton** to gain further insight into the neonatal unit there and the current successes and challenges they face.

A visit to see the **units at UHDB** are planned for the end of April alongside the **East Midlands Neonatal ODN** where we will be able to shadow the ODN in undertaking **peer reviews with parents** on the unit at that time. It will be an opportunity for us to hear what is currently happening in terms of **family integrated care** and what the future plans are as well as what the current **feedback** is.

Our next goal is to arrange a **focus group of parents** who have had neonatal experience in **Chesterfield** and we hope it to set a date for that in April.

We are also looking at **tongue tie provision** in relation to **infant feeding** and are keen for stories related to this in both maternity and neonatal settings."

HELP TO SHAPE MIDWIFERY TRAINING



UPCOMING EVENTS

DMNV Homebirth Working Group - April 8th 2022, 12-13.30, on MS Teams

The first meeting of this working group which will bring together midwives, service users, doulas and health care providers to promote a discussion on homebirths and improve information on this subject.

Following on from our first focus group in November 2021, we will continue to explore the themes and issues which emerged from our survey on experiences of loss together with midwives, bereaved parents and charities such as SANDS and look at how to improve support & information.
