NEWS FROM DERBY AND BURTON

This month we have made great strides in **forging new relationships** and progressing our work in the Derby and Burton area.

On the 6th of May we attended a reception at Royal Derby Hospital to meet Professor Jacqueline Dunkley-Bent, Chief Midwifery Officer for England. We asked about the role of Maternity Voice Partnerships, such as ours, in service improvement and it was encouraging to hear how she is championing the work of MVPs at the most senior levels.



In May a group of DMNV volunteers met with **Derby**Community Parent Programme to discuss jointworking. Plans are now underway for monthly
coffee mornings in Derby City Centre, which will be
attended by DCPP trained peer supporters, DMNV
volunteers and members of staff from UHDB.
Dates are being finalised and will be shared soon!

We also met with **Community Action Derby**, a charity providing support and guidance for voluntary and community groups. It was great to hear of all their projects with local groups and already have further meetings lined up to explore work together

on issues such as **health inequalities**, as well as participating in an upcoming community forum

event.



Jen Docherty and Fran Powers from the **Staffordshire and Stoke-On-Trent MNVP** joined us at our monthly online meeting and spoke to us about their MNVP. We are working closely together with regards to the Burton site, particularly on the **upcoming** <u>15 Steps</u>, set to take place on July 5th at Royal Derby Hospital and July 12th at Queen's Burton.

We also recently had the pleasure of talking with Natasha Stringer, UHDB's newly appointed, Deputy Head of Midwifery for Risk and Clinical Governance. We're looking forward to lots of work together in the coming months!

We have had great meetings with UHDB staff on a range of issues this mornth, from improving representation, inclusivity and diversity in the Trusts communications, to discussing homebirths, support for vulnerable women and the importance of continuity of carer. 
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
