Description of Board, Committee or Workstream	
<p>1. Remit/aims/objectives:</p> <p>The current community stroke rehabilitation pathway across Derby and Derbyshire is very complicated with multiple providers delivering a patchwork of services.</p> <p>Community stroke services across Derbyshire are stretched with little to no provision of Early Supported Stroke Discharge in some areas, this puts patients at a significant disadvantage based on their locality.</p> <p>In May 2022, an assessment of community stroke rehab services was undertaken with Derbyshire providers that sets out the pathways and challenges for both hospital and community service providers.</p> <p>As a result of this assessment, Derby and Derbyshire Integrated Care Board (ICB) along with stroke rehabilitation providers from across Derbyshire have been asked to review the current community stroke rehabilitation pathway and look at how improvements for patients can be made.</p> <p>A plan on how this can be achieved has been developed and this will be implemented over the next 8-12 months.</p> <p>2. Current membership</p> <p>The project currently holds a Stroke Rehab Task & Finish group, this is made up of key staff members across Derby and Derbyshire, including clinicians and operational staff from:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> University Hospitals of Derby & Burton Chesterfield Royal Hospital Derbyshire Community Health Services Derby and Derbyshire Integrated Care Board Derby and Derbyshire Allied Health Professional Council The Stroke Association The Integrated Stroke Delivery Network 	

What will the role involve?

Your role on the Stroke Rehab pathway redesign and Stroke rehab task & finish group will be to:

- Provide a patient and public perspective to considerations about the development and implementation of new pathway for Stroke rehabilitation.
- To read and review papers and commit to attending the Stroke rehab task and finish group meetings to provide a patient and public perspective.
- Draw on views and experiences within local groups and networks that may be involved in, to support discussions.
- Identify your support and development needs and discuss these with your lead contact.

Key requirements of the role:

- You should have lived; related experience or knowledge of the issues being discussed around Stroke Rehabilitation care pathways.
- To be passionate about helping to develop and shape Stroke Services across Derby and Derbyshire
- To articulate patient and public views from a broad range of perspectives, sometimes beyond your personal experience
- To be committed to addressing health inequalities
- To have an understanding of, and commitment to maintaining and respecting confidentiality
- To feel confident communicating effectively with a wide range of people, to voice opinions, and contribute to the debate
- To be able to contribute constructively, including taking an active part in discussions and keeping comments within scope of the published agenda (so far as is reasonable)
- To be open to, and respectful of other people's points of view
- To be willing to undertake personal development and training where appropriate to support understanding of the meeting content and your contribution to discussions.

Time commitment

- 1 task and finish group per month for 1.5 hours – dates and times to be finalised.
- Minutes to be circulated after the meeting for review and feedback.
- Occasional ad hoc meetings to help shape the new pathway – with agreement.
- Occasional governance\operational documentation to review and feedback to help shape the pathway.

Where do meetings take place?

Face to face at a locally agreed, central location and via MS Teams

- You will receive an induction and support sessions will be available.
