

What is Joy?



Joy is a software platform used by over 1000 GP Practices to support quick and consistent referrals into local services that target the wider determinants of health

You can use Joy from within the patient medical record (EMIS or SystemOne) to refer your patients to key non-clinical services for patients such as:

- Your local social prescribing service and wellbeing teams
 - Live Life Better Derbyshire services
 - The Stroke Association services
 - Coming soon - Macmillan Support Line
- ...And other services which are being added all the time

Key benefits:

1. **Quick referrals:** Patient information is pre-populated into referral forms and SNOMED codes are hard-coded & written back to the record
2. **Proactive interventions:** Can be used to reduce pressure on Practices and GPs
3. **Care Navigation from Reception:** Teams have local pathways at their fingertips to support patient access to non-clinical support
4. **Secure:** This process has been approved by NHS Digital, EMIS, TPP SystemOne

How do GPs refer using Joy?



Sending a referral in Joy is as quick as setting a task, and comes with the benefit of your first hand knowledge of the patient's needs.
