What is a patient and public partner?

They are people who are, or want to be, active in improving people's health and wellbeing and are interested in learning new skills. They will do this by sharing their lived experience e.g. having/or had a health condition, using their experience of healthcare services and what they thought of them, to help shape and improve health services.

They also understand that health and wellbeing is affected by many things (such as housing, employment, education, ethnicity) and so people's experience of health and wellbeing is not equal.

What are the women's health and the inclusivity group all about?

We know that sometimes women have to attend more than one place to get the care they need, services are not always joined up, and it can be difficult to access care, for example - smear tests and coil fitting may happen in different places, and are paid for by different organisations.

We also know that for different reasons, some groups of people find it even more difficult to get the care they need.

The women's health group and inclusivity group want to look at ways to make it easier for all women, girls and those with a cervix to get the care they need, in the right place, at the right time.

What does the role involve?

- · Attending online meetings
- Occasionally, it may be necessary to meet up in person

Time commitment: (between 6-9 months)

- Online meeting (1-1.5 hours each month)
- Reading notes before each meeting
- Occasionally respond to email

What would be expected of me?

- You should have good communication skills and feel comfortable sharing your views
- Offer ideas based on your lived experience
- Be focussed on finding positive solutions that will benefit all patients and users of services
- Help improve the difference in services that are experienced by different groups of people
- Be able to listen to others and be open to, and respectful of other people's points of view
- Be able to maintain confidentiality
- Undertake any training that may be needed
