After a few years unemployment following leaving college at 18, Freya had lost confidence in achieving her ambition of working in an information office. Zink helped her gain experience in similar roles and guided her application technique. Freya gained first a seasonal job then a part time role last year. She 'phoned this week to say that she had now got not just a full time position but as manager! Freya said this was because of the confidence experience and work coach support at Zink had given her.

Zink's advice worker helped him to apply for benefits and to register as homeless. James continued to come to Zink for lunch and took food for his evening meal. P3 found him more permanent accommodation and Zink helped him get there. James is now settled and planning to go back to work. He says he isn't sure would have made it if he hadn't had refuge at Zink HQ every day.
